

# Bridge Replacement: S-149 (West Faris Rd) Over Brushy Creek Greenville, SC

## Project Overview

- The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) proposes to replace the structurally deficient bridge along West Faris Road over Brushy Creek in Greenville County. The new bridge will meet current standards and will no longer be load posted.
- During construction, traffic will be rerouted approximately 3 miles. The proposed detour is W Faris Rd to Augusta St to Mills Ave to W Faris Road.

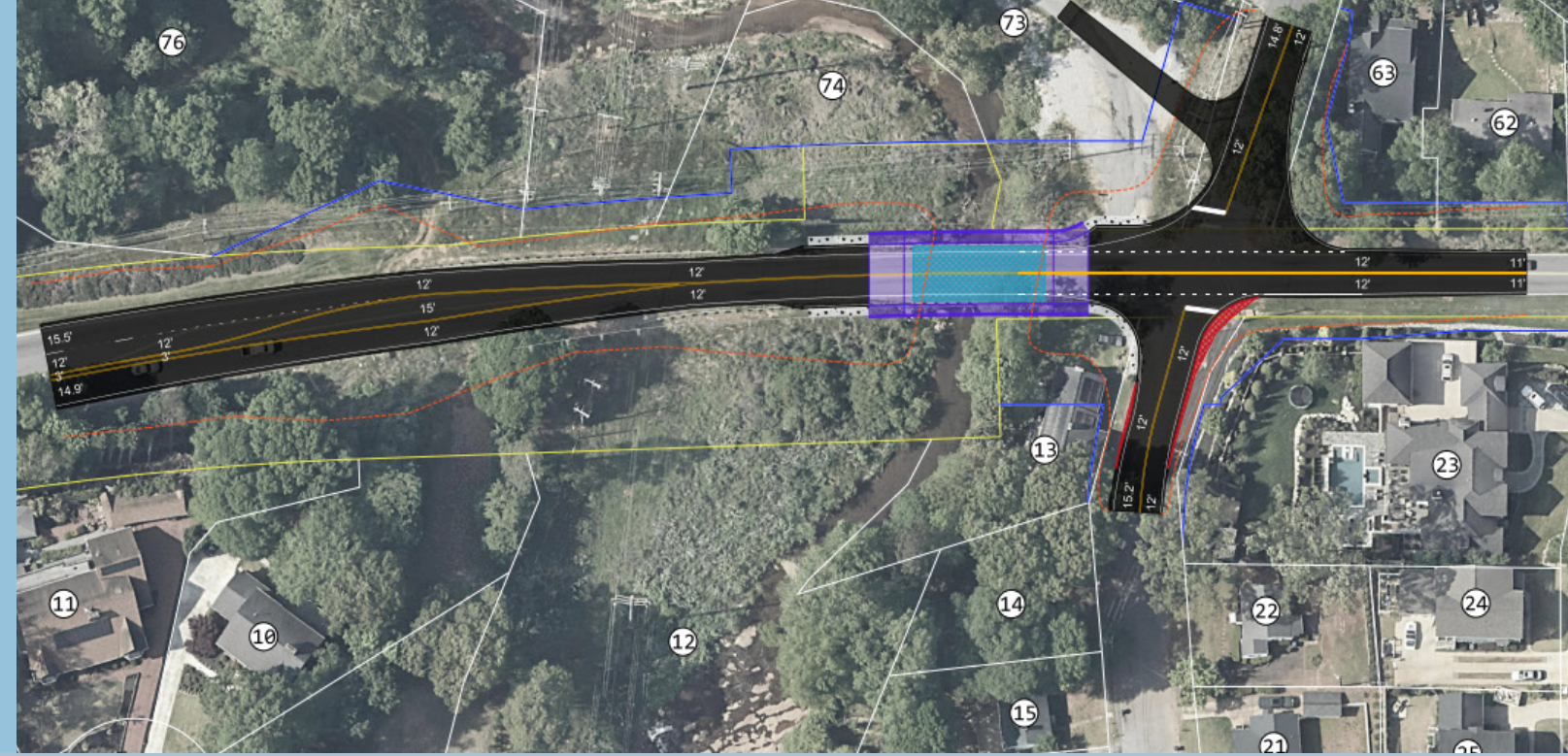

### Title VI Compliance

SCDOT complies with all nondiscrimination requirements set forth by the Federal regulations issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended. It should outline as completely as possible the facts and circumstances of the incident; and should be signed by the person making the complaint.
